


Population growth 1990 - 2020 and 2022 projection*




The 2020 Census shows that Juárez has a population of 1.51 million inhabitants with a projection* of 1.54 million inhabitants by 2022*.


Juárez is a mostly young city, with around 75.3% of its population between 0 and 45 years old.

Juarez total GDP.






In Juárez, Gross Domestic Product per capita has increased 20.0% in the last 10 years..

Companies by sector (November 2022)








Higher Education in Juárez school year 2021-2022




Ciudad Juárez has, as of 2023, 83 higher education institutions with an attendance of 61,918 students. Almost 6,652 of them graduated during the previous school year.

Graduate Students by study field




Patents granted to Juárez inventors 2016-2022
